SHRUBS

Abelia Kaleidoscope



Kaleidoscope Abelia (Abelia x grandiflora 'Kaleidoscope') brings a dazzling new twist to solid-color foliage. Glossy variegated leaves are splashed with colors of lemon-yellow and lime green during the summer months, but the display becomes even more vivid in autumn when shades of ruby red bring color to an otherwise drab winter garden.

As a member of the honeysuckle plant family, it should come as no surprise that Kaleidoscope Abelia has similarly shaped blooms. Its white flowers, sometimes with a hint of blush pink, are trumpet-shaped to hold the sweet nectar that hummingbirds and butterflies find irresistible. But don't expect to find only a few flowers here and there- Kaleidoscope Abelia is covered in a profusion of blossoms that look like a summer snowstorm.

Light Needs Full Sun to Part Shade

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Abelia Radiance



Vigorous and compact, offer radiant year-round color. Crimson stems contrast dramatically with variegated foliage that begins green with creamy yellow margins and ages to silvery-green and cream. Fragrant white flowers mid-summer to fall. Deer resistant.

Naturally compact mounding habit. Silvery-green and white variegated foliage. White flowers from Summer to Fall.

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Abelia Rose Creek



Lustrous leaves with a pinkish cast develop on crimson stems, mature to dark green and transform to a wonderful combination of purple and green in winter. Showy clusters of small, fragrant, white flowers emerge from rosy, pink sepals in summer. Its compact size makes an excellent foundation, container, or low hedge plant.

Clusters of tubular-shaped, dainty white flowers cover this dwarf form of abelia. 'Rose Creek' was selected by the University of Georgia for its low-mounding growth habit, crimson stem color, mildly fragrant white flowers, and exceptionally long blooming period (May until frost).

Since its release in 2001, this shrub has excited gardeners and commercial growers with its landscape potential. Growing 3 feet in height and 3 to 4 feet wide, this abelia can be used as a low hedge, foundation plant, or in decorative outdoor containers.

This evergreen shrub has leaves that emerge in spring with a pinkish cast, turning a lustrous dark green in summer. Wonderfully compact, 'Rose Creek' abelia will grow in full sun to partial shade. Once established, it is very drought and erosion tolerant. In cold winters it can be damaged to the ground but will regrow in the spring.

Light Needs Full sun, Partial sun

Mature Dimensions Low mounding shrub; reaches 2 to 3 ft. tall, 3 to 4 ft. wide.



SHRUBS

Ajuga Catlin's Giant



An excellent spreading groundcover that forms a dense, carpet-like mat of lush foliage - even in shady areas! Large green leaves have attractive purple-bronze hues and feature deep blue flower spikes from spring to summer. Great for use in containers, around shrubs or between stepping stones. An herbaceous perennial.

Light Needs

Filtered sun, Full sun, Partial shade, Partial sun.



Grows 3 to 6 in. tall, 12 to 24 in. wide; flowers reach 8 to 10 in. tall.



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Arborvitae Golden Globe



Handsome, bright golden yellow foliage covers this dense, globe-shaped shrub. It tolerates full sun exposure without sunburn. Thrives in regions with high humidity. Works well as a low hedge and in foundation plantings. Use in combination with dark green shrubs for a pleasing contrast. Evergreen.

Light Needs

Full sun, Partial sun

Average Size at Maturity

Moderate growing; reaches 4 ft. tall and wide.



SHRUBS

Arborvitae Mr. Bowling Ball



A naturally rounded dwarf shrub with dense evergreen foliage. The lacy, rich green foliage has excellent year-round color retention. Useful as a low hedge and in foundation plantings. Especially useful in areas where space is limited.

Light Needs Full sun

Average Size at Maturity

Slow growing; eventually reaches 24 to 30 in. tall and wide.



SHRUBS

Aucuba Japonica Gold Dust



This spotted leaved aucuba grows slowly as a dense rounded evergreen shrub. It prefers rich, moist welldrained soil in partial to full shade. Flowers appear in the in early spring and the foliage glossy, green blotched with yellow providing year-round interest. It is used as a potted house plant in the north. They can tolerate heavy shade, air pollution, and poor soils. Their showy leaves are most colorful in the full shade, and they provide a pop of color in dark corners as well as some interest during the winter months. Propagate it by stem cutting or seed, but propagating from cutting ensures that you maintain the coloring of the plant. In cold climates, it may die back in the winter.

Insects, Diseases, and Other Plant Problems: Somewhat problem-free. Mealybugs, scale, and nematode are occasional problems. Southern blight or fungal leaf spots do occur. Root rot happens in poorly drained or very wet soils.

Light Needs Full shade

Average Size at Maturity Slowly reaches 4 to 6 ft. tall and wide.



SHRUBS

Azalea George L. Taber



Masses of showy, single, light orchid blooms with white variegation. A beautiful evergreen shrub for use as a hedge, screen, or mass plantings. A sun-tolerant Southern indica Azalea that thrives in full to dappled sun in cooler northern climates; provide shade from intense afternoon sun in warm regions. Evergreen.

Light Needs

Filtered sun, Full sun, Partial shade, Partial sun.

Average Size at Maturity

Moderate growing; reaches 6 to 8 ft. tall, 4 to 6 ft. wide.

SHRUBS

Azalea Autumn Royalty Encore



A beautiful, small azalea shrub that extends the flowering season! Huge, deep purplish pink blooms, many with white throats, and some with solid color. Great color for containers or use as low border shrub. Satsuki varieties can often handle a little more sun than most azaleas, though dappled sunlight is recommended.

Light Needs

Filtered sun, Partial shade, Partial sun.

Average Size at Maturity

Slowly reaches 3 to 3½ ft. tall and wide.

Bloom Time Only Purple Azalea that Blooms Spring, Summer, and Fall

Soil Needs Azalea & Camellia Food

Note there are many dwarf azalea varieties available. Inquire for availability.



SHRUBS

Barberry Crimson Pygmy



A dwarf, densely branched form displaying deep crimson colored foliage all season long. Best color when planted in full sun. Excellent color contrast against green or gold-leafed plants. A great choice for mass plantings, particularly as a low hedge or border plant. Deciduous.

Light Needs Full sun

Average Size at Maturity

Moderate growing; reaches 2 ft. tall, 3 ft. wide.



SHRUBS

Barberry Orange Rocket



Vibrant coral-orange new foliage ages to a medium green, then turns ruby red in autumn. This awardwinning, compact shrub has a vigorous upright growth habit and improved resistance to rust. Use to brighten the landscape in mass plantings, as a specimen plant, or in a container. Deciduous.

Light Needs Full sun, Partial sun

Average Size at Maturity

Moderate growing; reaches 4 to 5 ft. tall, 2 to 3 ft. wide in 10 years.



SHRUBS

Barberry Golden Rocket



Expect dramatic color from spring to fall with this unique shrub with its narrow, upright habit and showy, bright yellow foliage that creates excellent color contrast in mixed borders. This variety produces few flowers and little to no viable seed, making it a great alternative over many other barberries. Deciduous.

Light Needs Full sun

Average Size at Maturity Slowly reaches 3 to 5 ft. tall, 2 to 3 ft. wide.



SHRUBS

Boxwood Green Mountain



A vigorous evergreen shrub with bright green foliage that retains good color throughout winter. The upright, naturally cone-shaped habit makes it an excellent candidate for topiary forms, and a striking container or formal garden accent. Use in mass plantings to create either a free-form or a sculpted hedge.

Light Needs Full sun, Partial sun

Average Size at Maturity Grows 5 ft. tall, 3 ft. wide in natural form.



SHRUBS

Boxwood Korean Winter Gem



An excellent evergreen shrub for small hedges. Among the hardiest of the small-leaved boxwoods, the rich green foliage can acquire a golden bronze hue in cold winter zones but is one of the first to become green again in spring. Makes a wonderful addition to formal gardens, providing year-round interest.



SHRUBS

Boxwood Korean Wintergreen



The cold hardy Wintergreen Boxwood, also known as Korean Boxwood, is an incredibly versatile shrub. It adds appeal to casual or formal landscape designs, and when grouped, Wintergreen complements most any garden and looks fantastic in decorative pots to accent a deck or patio.

Plus, it's compact and easy to shape. This evergreen, dense shrub performs like a superstar when shaped into topiary designs or even bonsai art. The slow-growing Wintergreen Boxwood typically gains only 2 to 3 inches annually, maturing to heights of about 3 feet with a 4 to 5 foot spread with little upkeep.

Wintergreen Boxwood is great-looking, with oval leaves that feature a finely textured look as their bright green hues darken slightly with age. An ongoing two-tone feature of bright and dark green foliage adds depth to this ornamental shrub.

But aside from its beauty and adaptable, hassle-free growth (with pest, deer, and disease resistance), it's just as easy to grow for beginners and experts alike.

Light Needs Full sun, Partial sun

Average Size at Maturity Reaches 4 to 6 ft. tall and wide.



SHRUBS

Camellia sasanqua Bonanza - Pink



A versatile spreading habit with a profusion of bold scarlet peony-like blooms and glossy, dark green foliage. Use to create a colorful low hedge, espalier, or tall groundcover or as an evergreen foundation plant for sheltered sites with bright shade. Excellent flowers for cutting. An early season bloomer.

Light Needs

Filtered sun, Partial shade, Partial sun.

Average Size at Maturity

Moderate growing; reaches 4 to 5 ft. tall, spreading wider.

SHRUBS

Camellia Snowman - White



The Winter's Snowman Camellia is an upright compact shrub perfect for a tall informal hedge planting. New leaf growth in the spring is an interesting burgundy color which turns into glossy dark green as the leaves grow and age. Pink flushed buds open to fragrant, small ruffled semi-double snowy white flowers from November through December.

Like most Camellias, this plant needs consistently moist, well-drained, acidic soil with high organic matter. Provide a sheltered site as flower and leaf buds may experience damage by cold winter winds. Early morning and direct afternoon sun can be too harsh so plant in partial shade and be aware that an area too heavily shaded can limit flowering. The size and shape of the plant can be controlled, and overall health improved by pruning the branches after flowering.

This showy plant is great for cut flowers and is mildly resistant to damage by deer.

Light Needs Filtered Sun

Average Size at Maturity Moderate growing 12 ft. tall, and only 5 ft. wide.

SHRUBS

Camellia Yuletide - Red



The Yuletide Camellia is a beautiful evergreen shrub that grows in shady places and produces glorious bright-red flowers at Christmas time and right through the winter. It will grow from zone 7 into warmer zones outdoors and can also be grown in a pot as a porch plant in much colder areas. It needs no pruning to form an upright, dense bush with handsome deep-green glossy leaves, reaching 6 feet or more in height. It grows best in light shade but will grow in full sun too if the ground is moist. It prefers acidic soil but can be easily treated to grow in all kinds of soil and it is usually free of pests and diseases.

Large, bright-red flowers in mid-winter Handsome glossy rich-green evergreen foliage Broad, upright growth to 6 feet tall Perfect for semi-shaded locations Easily grown in large pots and planters

Single, brilliant red blooms centered with bright yellow stamens make an elegant statement in the winter garden. The glossy, dark green foliage creates a handsome natural hedge, foundation shrub or espalier specimen. A mid-season bloomer. Evergreen.



SHRUBS

Cham Pisifera Gold Mop



A compact conifer with interesting, thread-like needles that weep and drape over the entire shrub. Bright, golden yellow foliage, even in full sun. An excellent semi-erect, mop-headed landscape specimen or accent plant that makes a nice background border or small hedge. Slow growing: size can be maintained with minimal pruning. Evergreen.

Light Needs Full sun

Average Size at Maturity Slowly grows to 6 ft. tall, 8 ft. wide; keep smaller with annual pruning.



SHRUBS

Cham Obtusa Golden Hinoki Cypress



Sprays of feathery bright golden-yellow foliage distinguish this superior cultivar. Exceptional color for winter. Versatile upright grower makes ideal soft background for flowering shrubs. A fine informal hedge, privacy screen or windbreak.

Light Needs Full sun, Partial sun

Average Size at Maturity Quickly reaches 8 to 10 ft. tall, 3 to 4 ft. wide.



SHRUBS

Cryptomeria japonica 'Globosa Nana'



A superb selection that retains a natural, dense, dome shape with little care. The finely textured foliage breaks up the bold effects of large leaved plants. Foliage becomes rusty red in winter. Enjoy as a single specimen or group as a filler. Evergreen.

Light Needs Full sun, Partial sun

Average Size at Maturity

Slowly reaches 2 to 3 ft. tall, slightly wider; 4 to 8 ft. tall with age.



SHRUBS

Daylily Stella



Hemerocallis hybrid 'TG08'

This evergreen version of the award-winning Stella de Oro Daylily is an early bloomer and re-blooms. Fragrant golden-yellow trumpet flowers rise above a dense clump of grassy green foliage.

Light Needs Full Sun

Mature Dimensions 10-12" high x 10-12" wide



SHRUBS

Emerald Heights Distylium



A dense and compact evergreen shrub with excellent resistance to pests and disease. Cascading, glossy green foliage produces an interesting, layered effect. Red-maroon flowers bloom late winter into early spring. Highly adaptable, and an ideal alternative to more ordinary hollies and laurels for borders, hedges, and mass plantings.



SHRUBS

Emerald Gaiety Wintercreeper



Deep, emerald, green leaves edged in sparkling white are tinged with pink in winter. A mounding evergreen shrub with a dense, erect habit. Excellent for use in small, clipped hedges and foundation plantings. Stems may root where they touch the ground, and if given support may be trained to climb.

Light Needs Full sun, Partial sun

Average Size at Maturity

Reaches 2 to 3 ft. tall in 10 yrs; 4 to 5 ft. tall, 3 ft. wide with age.



SHRUBS

Euonymus Golden



An excellent choice for a colorful hedge, this evergreen shrub displays dense, bold green and gold variegated foliage on an upright growth habit. This tough shrub is adaptable to adverse conditions and tolerates poor, lean soils. Versatile and easy to care for, it requires minimal attention once established, but takes well to regular pruning.

Full sun, Partial sun



SHRUBS

Euonymus Silver King



Euonymus japonicus 'Silver King' An attractive hedge plant with silvery white margins on glossy green leaves that adds unique color and texture to the landscape. Can be grouped to form a low screen. Highly adaptable; tolerates poor, lean soils and heat. An excellent topiary specimen for the landscape or containers. Evergreen.

SHRUBS

Fatsia japonica



Large, exotic, rich green foliage adds an exciting and bold tropical look to landscapes and patios. Great in a shaded entryway or patio, or in a sheltered spot near a water garden or dipping pool. Perfect for outdoor containers or as a houseplant. Ideal for low light, urban settings. Winter flowers are followed by black ornamental berries. Evergreen.

Light Needs

Filtered sun, Full shade, Partial shade, Partial sun.

Average Size at Maturity

Moderate growing; reaches 5 to 8 ft. tall and wide.



SHRUBS

Forsythia



Brilliant yellow flowers in early spring. A dwarf forsythia cultivar that is noted for its compact-spreading shape. Early bloom makes this shrub a true harbinger of spring. Fast growing with a semi-arching habit. Best flowering if planted in full sun.

Light Needs

Filtered sun, Full sun, Partial sun.

Average Size at Maturity

Moderate grower 1-2 ft. tall to 4 ft. wide.



SHRUBS

Grass Karl Foerster



Create a stunning vertical effect with feathery stalks that emerge reddish brown in spring and turn a rich golden color in fall. Blooms two to three weeks earlier than common feather reed grass. Thrives in wet soils yet tolerates drier conditions. Stalks make great cut flowers. Sterile seeds do not produce unwanted seedlings.

Light Needs Full sun

Average Size at Maturity

Foliage reaches 2 ft. tall and wide; bloom stalks reach 6 ft. tall.



SHRUBS

Grass Pink Muhly



Stately, showy foliage with an exceptional, upright, slightly arching form. Glittering clouds of vivid purple plumes emerge 3 to 5 weeks later than Regal Mist, lending far richer color from late summer to fall. Foliage stays green much longer than others of its type. An outstanding single specimen; spectacular massed in a meadow or native garden.

Light Needs

Full sun, Partial sun

Average Size at Maturity

2 to 3 ft. tall, clumping slightly wider; blooms reach 4 ft. tall.

Grass Adagio Miscanthus



One Adagio Maiden Grass is a stunning centerpiece and standout specimen in your garden, but multiples are breathtakingly spectacular in masses. Mix them into your perennial borders. Watch them sing by your evergreens. Pot up in a large planter or container for graceful accents.

SHRUBS

Grass Morning Light



Dense clumps of slender, green blades with creamy white margins and midveins that create a shimmering silvery appearance. A superb grass that adds visual excitement wherever used. Reddish inflorescences that persist through winter provide an interesting accent to bare winterscapes. Wonderful texture for beds and borders.

Light Needs Full sun, Partial sun

Average Size at Maturity Forms clumps 5 ft. tall, 3 to 4 ft. wide; plumes reach 6 ft. tall.

SHRUBS

Grass Little Zebra Dwarf Japanese Silver



A lovely dwarf ornamental grass with graceful, arching blades with eye-catching ivory to yellow highlights. Tall, upright flower stems topped with feathery, silver-white, summer plumes that soften and curl as they dry. A bold, striking selection perfect for borders, containers, and naturalized areas or edges of water gardens.

Light Needs

Full sun, Partial sun

Average Size at Maturity

Moderate growing; forms a dense foliage clump 3 to 4 ft. tall and wide.



SHRUBS

Grass Hameln



An attractive grass highlighted by fluffy, buff-colored plumes that arch above the lush, green fountain of foliage. In the fall, the foliage turns a lovely golden russet color. Creates a terrific contrast when used among shrubs or as a backdrop in a perennial bed.

Light Needs Full sun

Average Size at Maturity Moderate growing; reaches 2 to 3 ft. tall, 1 to 2 ft. wide.

SHRUBS

Holly Carissa



Carissa Holly is a compact, rounded shrub. At a mature height of just 2 to 3 feet, it rarely needs any pruning. Spring blooms have a great fragrance, but Carissa Holly does not provide nearly as many of the red winter berries as other holly shrubs.

Carissa Holly is a perfect choice for a low maintenance small hedge, as a border along a walkway or driveway. It can also be used a specimen in almost any smaller space. They also do well in containers.

SHRUBS

Holly Dwarf Burford



Dwarf Burford Holly is a broadleaf evergreen with ornamental features. Lovely as both an accent and low hedge, this vibrant shrub is sure to provide year-round interest in your yard. Its emerald-green new growth blends majestically with the darker green of the mature foliage—and stand-out in coloring among other common evergreen shrubs. Clusters of petites, pristine-white flowers appear in spring to later give way to small berry-like fruit. Its fall fruit adds additional drama to the luster of the foliage. It has a compact, mounded habit and is very easy to care for. Unlike many other shrubs, you won't need a pollenizer to enjoy the decorative advantages of the fall/winter fruit but having one will certainly allow your Holly to bear heavier.

With maturity, this plant will have clusters of tiny white flowers that develop into bright red berries in early autumn. This cultivar is hardy from zones 7b to 9b. It grows rapidly to a height of 10 to 12 feet and a width of 6 to 8 feet.

Grow this tough, durable plant in sun to partial shade. 'Chindo' tolerates a wide range of soils and is also mildly resistant to damage by deer. When established, this viburnum can withstand drought-like weather conditions and becomes carefree with no serious pest problems.

Choose 'Chindo' viburnum for your next hedge or evergreen screen, or as a large accent planting. This shrub is a JC Raulston Arboretum Selection since 2003. 'Chindo' Viburnum will be a terrific addition to any sunny Carolina landscape.



SHRUBS

Viburnum Doublefile



Doublefile viburnum is a medium-sized, deciduous shrub that is commonly found in the landscape. This shrub is native to China and Japan and grows 8 to 10 feet tall and as wide. It is multi-stemmed and has horizontal branching giving a layered appearance. The white flowers in spring are showy cymes followed by red to black fruit the birds love. Fall leaf color is red to purple. It grows well in sun to part shade and is adaptable to soil types. Prune as needed after flowering.

Showy blooms occur 'double file', in axils of leaves with one on each side of a node on horizontal branches in late spring. The lace-capped flowerhead has showy sterile flowers that encircle non-showy inner fertile flowers. It is easily identified by its leaves which are ovate, pubescent, and appear pleated with serrate margins. The pleats are comprised of nearly straight, impressed veins.

Plant in moist well-drained soil with mulch around the roots to keep them cool and moist. Tolerates full sun to partial shade. Use as a hedge, as a foundation shrub, in the shrub border, or as a specimen. This shrub is easily transplanted.



SHRUBS

Viburnum Chinese Snowball



Chinese snowball viburnum is a popular deciduous flowering shrub in the Viburnaceae family. It is native to mainland China and grows up to 25 feet tall and 20 feet wide with a rounded vase-shaped form. The flowers are the largest of the snowball viburnums. It is a hardy shrub from zones 6 through 9.

This shrub produces profuse dome-shaped, rounded, infertile flowers in the spring and some areas produce a flush bloom in the fall. The flowers emerge chartreuse then quickly turn to white and are sterile with no fragrance. The leaves are semi-evergreen in the southernmost growing zones, opposite and pubescent with serrate margins. Since the blooms are sterile, there is no fruit production.

A variety of Viburnum macrocephalum var. keteleeri is found in the wild, and it has both sterile and fertile florets, so sometimes fruits are seen on this plant.

Use this plant as a specimen, in groups, for borders, in foundation plantings, or for informal hedges. It has good disease resistance.



SHRUBS

Viburnum Spring Bouquet



A beautiful, low-growing evergreen shrub with dark green foliage and lightly fragrant, pinkish white spring flowers. Its dense, compact, upright growth habit makes this a favorite choice for small hedges, screens, or foundation plantings.

Vinca Minor Common Periwinkle



One of the best groundcovers for shade, displaying large, violet-blue, pinwheel-shaped flowers against glossy dark green leaves. Sun tolerant in cool northern zones. In hot summer areas, plant in dappled to deep shade. Good for use in firescaping. Evergreen in most climates.

Use this shady groundcover for those hard-to-plant spots--its evergreen trailing stems will look fine yearround. It makes a good groundcover for shrub plantings.

Vinca Major



Big Leaf Periwinkle Is an evergreen ground cover from Asia Minor which forms a dense mat. Prefers part shade to shade in fertile well-drained soil. The blue to violet flowers appears in spring and may bloom intermittently through autumn. It can be grown in containers outside of zone 7. Taller growing than V. minor; utilized more for naturalized aspect.

Its non-flowering stems grow along the ground, with the flowering stems stand upright.

When attempting to cover a smaller area, planting 8" apart will give you a quick cover. For larger areas, place your plants 12"-18" apart. Great plant for beds where bulbs are located. Its dense foliage will also help to keep weeds under control. Want to enjoy its showy flowers without it becoming invasive in your garden, consider it as an annual container plant. Its trailing habit also makes a great selection for a hanging basket or window boxes.

This plant is considered invasive in several states surrounding NC and California. It spreads as its nodes encounter the surrounding soil, forming roots. A cutting from a stem placed in another suitable location can easily root, thereby starting an additional stand of periwinkle. When grown along streamsides, moving waters can also dislodge pieces of the stems, wash them downstream, where they can form additional colonies.



SHRUBS

Yew Duke Gardens Cephalotaxus harringtonia



Japanese plum yew is an evergreen, needled shrub, or small tree in the Taxaceae (yew) family. The cultivar 'Duke Gardens' was discovered at Duke Gardens in Durham, North Carolina and is noted for its compactness.

Ideal for the southeastern United States, as it tolerates both the summer heat and humidity unlike other yews, 'Duke Gardens' has a dense spreading mounding habit.

This plant prefers moist, well-drained soil but tolerates dry, sandy, or clay soil. Plant it in full sun if you have cool summers; otherwise, it needs partial shade and tolerates shade better than most other needled evergreens.

Once established this plant is drought tolerant and deer resistant. 'Duke Gardens' grows slowly to 2 to 4 feet tall and wide.

Japanese plum yew works well in small spaces, a woodland or shade garden as an accent or planted in mass along a border. Its fragrant glossy needles provide year-round interest and makes an interesting change in the landscape from the typical junipers.



SHRUBS

Hicks Yew Taxus x media 'Hicksii'



An excellent evergreen shrub for tall hedges and privacy screens. The long, upright-growing branches with dense, glossy, dark green foliage naturally form a narrow, columnar habit that works well as a foundation plant, or placed in pairs at entries or doorways.

Light Needs

Full sun, Partial sun

Lore

All species of this genus are poisonous. One American species is the source of the cancer drug, Taxol. In England yew trees were restricted to church yards where they were not subject to livestock grazing, which caused many animal deaths in the past. Interestingly, deer may graze on them, unaffected. Birds are also attracted to the fruit, which they eat without consequence, as the flesh is not toxic to most, and the seed passes through intact.



Yew Densiformis

Yew Fastigiata



Taxus baccata 'Fastigiata' is one of the world's most-popular conifers. It is a narrowly fastigiate female clone with stiffly erect branches holding long, radially arranged dark-green needles and showy red berries. As plants age, they will become more broadly conical and are often seen sheered with a flat top.

After 10 years of growth, a mature specimen will measure 4.5 to 10 feet (1.5 - 3 m) tall and 2 to 3 feet (60 - 90 cm) wide, an average growth rate of 6 to 12 inches (15 - 30 cm).

This cultivar originated as a random mutated plant found growing the wild in the hills above Florence Court County, Fermanagh, Ireland in the late 1770s. A farmer, named Mr. Willis is said to have transplanted the mother plant to his farm in 1780. Being that this is such an old cultivar and fastigiate seedlings are quite common, including male clones, it is probably more appropriate to name the plant, Taxus baccata forma fastigiata. Some of the common names seen in the nursery trade include Irish yew and Florence Court Yew. Taxus baccata 'Hibernica' and 'Stricta' are synonyms.

Yew Cephalotaxus harringtonia 'Prostrata'



Chinese fringetree is somewhat taller than white fringetree, usually growing 15 to 25 feet tall. The habit is like white fringetree, with a rounded, spreading crown, but is usually less open.

Emily Bruner' is a hybrid cross between I. cornuta and I. latifolia initially developed by a student at the University of Tennessee. 'Emily Bruner' is an evergreen shrub or a small tree that left to grow to its full height will reach 19 1/2 feet tall. It is noted for its bright, glossy green leaves, good fruit production and a dense, broad, and pyramidal form.

The large, persistent red fruits encircle the stems, creating winter interest. This plant requires more nitrogen than other hollies to maintain the consistent dark green foliage. The plant is dioecious (meaning individual flowers are either male or female, but only one sex is found on any one plant so both male and female plants must be grown if seed is required). It is pollinated by bees. 'Emily Bruner' is a female plant and requires a male plant as a pollinator to produce fruit. The 'James Swan' cultivator is the recommended male pollinator, but the Holly Society of America also recommends ''Blue Holly', 'Blue Stallion', 'Blue Prince' or 'Blue Boy'. They also state that any male holly that blooms at the same time (spring) can act as a pollinator.

This holly is tolerant of most soils except poorly drained ones and can be grown in full to partial sun. It is tolerant of heat and humidity and is drought tolerant once established, making it a good choice for the south. Prune in the late winter to control its size if needed. The spiny leaves make this a good choice for a barrier or privacy screen or use as an impenetrable hedge. It can also be planted as a specimen, used in small groups, or planted along a foundation. Mature plants do not tolerate root disturbance, so it is best to site the plant in its permanent position, preferably one that provides winter protection for the first year or two.

Seminole and Miccosukee Indians refer to the Sabal Palm as the "tree of life," for it has provided them shelter, food, tools, utensils, and fiber for baskets and netting. The Sabal Palm often hosts other plants in its "boots," including Strangler Fig, Wild Grape, Virginia Creeper, and a variety of beautiful threatened and endangered ferns.

Slow growing; reaches 50 ft. tall.

Palm Pindo



Striking in its look, the Pindo's feather-leaf, silver-colored fronds (some call it more of a turquoise) produce an exceptional contrast to a typical lawn's color.

These are some of the hardiest palms in South Florida, doing fine in cooler temperatures, blazing sunlight, salty air, and dry conditions.

An indigenous plant in some cases called "Jelly Palm," the Pindo Palm generates edible berries that can be made into jelly with a sweet banana/pineapple flavor. The fruits are around 1 inch in size with a seed in the middle. However, just one tree is self-fertile and will produce large bunches of dates every season.

The style of this palm is distinct yet functional. It is often used for smaller lawns, found in moderate coastline homes, an antique Florida bungalow, or dressing up the backyard of a ranch-style residence. Pindo Palms look great in large forest estates, horse ranches or waterside houses as an intense spot in the landscape.

Palm Windmill



The Windmill Palm is the world's hardiest palm and can be seen growing in the most unlikely places far north of regions typically associated with palm trees. This tough but beautiful tree may grow to 40 feet in height or more, but with its narrow form it doesn't take up a lot of space compared to other palms.

Hardiest palm in the word – to 5 degrees or even less Shade tolerant too Narrow form is ideal for smaller spaces. Attractive circular leaves clustered on a tall trunk. Exotic beauty but easy to grow. The Windmill Palm will grow easily in zones 7, 8 and 9 and can even be grown in sheltered spots in the warmer parts of zone 6. It is shade tolerant and grows in almost any soil and location. It is fast-growing and trouble-free and will bring a touch of the exotic to any garden. If you have always wanted a palm tree to remind you of tropical vacations, the Windmill Palm will do that in the most unlikely regions.

Pine Loblolly

Vitex Chaste Tree



Chaste trees (Vitex agnus-castus) have many characteristics that make them desirable garden shrubs. Apart from the clusters of small violet flowers, these plants have aromatic grayish-green, lanceolate leaves. The large deciduous shrubs have a vase-shaped growth that spreads upward and outward. This attractive landscape plants attracts butterflies and pollinators while in bloom during summer and fall.

The woody plant Vitex agnus-castus grows as a large multi-stemmed shrub. Although referred to as the vitex tree or chaste tree, the vitex plant generally grows as a sizeable bushy shrub. But in warmer climates, vitex can grow as a small multi-trunked tree. Typically, vitex bushes grow between 3 and 15 ft. (1 - 4.5 m) tall, and vitex trees grow between 15 and 20 ft. (4.5 - 6 m) tall.

Vitex agnus-castus is an aromatic shrubby plant in the family Lamiaceae. This means that chaste trees (vitex) are related to herbs such as mint, sage, thyme, and lavender. The Vitex genus of flowering plants is considered as species of tropical or sub-tropical woody shrubs. Some species of Vitex also grow in temperate zones.

Frost rarely affects the roots, and vitex bushes come back to life the following spring. Heavy pruning in temperate climates promotes flowering and continuous blooming.

Vitex agnus-castus is said to have medicinal properties and was used as a tonic for male and female reproductive systems.

Wax Myrtle



Common waxmyrtle or Southern bayberry (Morella cerifera; formerly Myrica cerifera) is native to South Carolina and other southeastern States. Its range is from New Jersey to Florida and westward to Texas.

This broadleaf evergreen shrub or tree grows quickly to 15 to 20 feet high and wide. The leaves are glossy green and typically 1½ to 3 inches long and ½ to 3¼ inches wide, sometimes bigger (4½ inches long and 2 inches wide). Inconspicuous flowers appear in early spring, followed by fruit in late summer through winter. The grayish-white fruits are small ($\frac{1}{8}$ inch wide), heavily coated with wax and massed in clusters on the stems of the previous season's growth. Waxmyrtle plants are either male or female. Only female plants bear berries.

Common waxmyrtle grows very fast, sometimes as much as 5 feet in height and width in a single growing season.

Wax myrtles are useful as screen plants, informal hedges, or roadside plantings. The foliage and berries are pleasantly aromatic. Birds are attracted to wax myrtles, which they use for food and shelter. The waxy berries were used for making candles in colonial times.

Yew Podocarpus macrophyllus



An attractive pyramidal garden or patio tree with dense, upright branching and narrow, leathery foliage that takes to shearing well. A versatile, slow growing, and low maintenance evergreen. An effective accent, screen, or clipped hedge. Well-suited to large containers or tubs, and for formal topiary. This dioecious conifer is grown from seed; we cannot guarantee if a plant purchased will be male or female.

Light Needs:

Full sun to Partial sun

Reaches 15 to 20 ft. tall, 6 to 8 ft. wide in 10 years; larger with age.

With its dense, upright form, this Podocarpus can become a columnar corner plant. Line them up, with spaces in between, as a repeating element behind traditional perennial borders. Plant as a solid hedge for a manicured privacy screen along property lines and side yards. In warm-winter climates, it makes a great evergreen background that can be shaped to your needs. Excellent choice for front yards needing separation between multistory buildings.

Zelkova Green Vase



Zelkova serrata, commonly called Japanese zelkova, is a medium to large deciduous tree, typically growing to 50-80' tall with a spreading, generally upward-branching, vase-shaped crown. It is native to Japan, Taiwan, and eastern China. It is noted for its graceful shape, clean foliage, attractive bark, and resistance to Dutch elm disease. Zelkova has in fact been promoted in recent years as a substitute for American elm (Ulmus americana) because of its resistance to Dutch elm disease.

Insignificant small green flowers appear in spring as the foliage emerges. Flowers give way to small, nonshowy, ovate, wingless drupes that ripen in autumn. Oblong-elliptic medium green leaves (to 3" long) with coarse, ciliate marginal teeth and acuminate tips. Fall color is variable, ranging from undistinguished yellow to attractive shades of yellow orange to red brown. Smooth gray bark in youth exfoliates with age to reveal orange-brown inner bark. Zelkova is valued as a commercial timber tree in Japan.

No serious insect or disease problems. Highly resistant to Dutch elm disease. Phloem necrosis, wilts and cankers may occur. Insect visitors include leaf miner, beetles, and scale. Spider mites can be a problem in hot, dry summers.
